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What is Reflexology?

Reflexology is a simple, holistic, non-invasive form of therapy that treats the whole body through the feet and hands. The internal body structures and organs are mirrored on the feet and hands with every part of the body having a corresponding reflex point.

Specific thumb and finger pressure techniques on the feet or hands allow energy channels to be unblocked thereby reducing tension, improving circulation and promoting balance within the body. This allows the body to heal itself, thus achieving a state of good health naturally.

About the School

Waikato School of Reflexology provides professional tuition in reflexology to Diploma Level. The school meets the required standard for professional membership of Reflexology New Zealand (RNZ), the governing body for reflexology in New Zealand. As RNZ is a self-governing body it sets its own educational standards.

Diploma in Reflexology Overview

The following are the broad objectives of the course:

- To develop an understanding of the origins and development of reflexology
- To develop an understanding of the feet and hands in relation to reflexology practices
- To develop methods of reflexology application
- To develop the practice of foot care for clients using client charts and recording data accurately and professionally
- To develop an understanding of the ethics, limitations and business requirements of the practice of reflexology in New Zealand
- To develop an awareness of research methodology in relation to reflexology.

Entry Requirements

- Entry will be through application via enrolment form, and paid course fees.
- Applicants must be a minimum of 18 years of age at commencement of study
- Students will have to show they are able to commit themselves to study
- Students are required to hold a current First Aid Certificate that includes CPR training before commencing their case studies.

The course will run over a period of twelve months. There will be twelve (12] weekend seminars held on a monthly basis with final practical and theory exams taking place on the 12th weekend.

Study material for each module will be available at each weekend seminar

Assessment Requirements

Students will be required to complete the following and to show competency in each to a level required for a PASS. Where work does not meet this level there will be an option to resubmit, this should be discussed with your tutor.

- Attend all weekend seminars
- Active participation in student clinics (held during weekend seminars)
- Complete practical assessments throughout the course
- Complete six theoretical assignments
- Complete and submit six individual case studies, each study containing six treatment sessions
 - One case study must include a research approach to a specific condition
- Present evidence of completion of a minimum of 10 hours of home practicum
- Final one hour practical exam with an assessor
- Final two hour theory exam

If a student is required to re-sit the final practical exam or the final theory exam, there is an additional fee of \$150.00 payable.

In addition to the above requirements, BEFORE your Diploma of Reflexology can be issued you must complete and pass the following:

- NZQA Level 4 equivalent (or higher level) Certificate in Anatomy and Physiology. (You may be able to cross credit this).

Attendance:

Attendance times: Saturday and Sunday 9.00am to 5.00pm.

Note

It is recognized that due to extenuating circumstances some students may miss a weekend seminar. As each weekend seminar covers a complete module of assessment you will need to discuss your absence with the tutor and make arrangements to cover the missed programme content.

All absences must be notified

Completion / Extensions

- It is anticipated that, unless extenuating circumstances exist, the course will be completed in the set period, i.e. within two (2) years from commencement of the course.
- In the event the course work has not been completed within the above timeframe, you may be granted an extension. Application must be made in writing.
- Any approval of extensions or deferment of study will be at the sole discretion of the Waikato School of Reflexology.
- Any student granted a one year deferment during the first 12 month period must recommence study in the following year at the point of cessation.

Course Costs

The course fee for the Diploma in Reflexology is \$280.00 for each of the eleven modules, and a \$160.00 exam fee. Fees are payable at each seminar or by arrangement with the tutor.

This course does not qualify for student loans or allowances

Completion of First Aid Certificate (incl. CPR instruction)

NZQA Level 4 (or equivalent) Certificate in Anatomy and Physiology

Purchase of own chair or table for home practicum and case studies

Chairs and stools required for tuition will be available at weekend seminars
You will be required to supply your own chair linen.
